Rehoboth Home

The Rehoboth Home has been caring for the children of India since its founding in July of 1985.

Mrs. D. Rani is the director of the home and cares for the children with the help of her daughter, a Bible woman, and three helpers. The home is located in a poor rural area several hours from the city of Chenni, Tamil Nadu.

Mrs. Rani operated the home with her husband until his death in 1990. She is a retired principal and spends evenings

helping the children with their school work. Mrs. Rani's younger daughter decided to dedicate her life to reaching the lost with the love of Jesus and caring for the children in the home. When the children are attending school she visits nearby villages and shares with the women who are at home.

The children all attend a Christian school, located directly behind the home, until they complete 10th grade. Upon concluding the 10th grade they are required to take government exams. If they pass, they are eligible for higher education which requires paying a tuition. After the children in the home finish school and leave the home they are either visited weekly by the director, visit during holiday seasons, or stay in touch with the home by written correspondence.

The children have assigned chores in the home. After chores are completed the children often play in the school fields. They enjoy jumping rope, ring toss, cricket, and tag.

The children learn to worship, pray, and read their Bibles during morning and evening devotional time, Sunday school, and special Bible classes. Every Tuesday a Pastor from the school comes and conducts a Bible study with the children. In the home they learn

many Bible verses and have Bible quizzes regularly. On Sundays they go with a Bible woman and an evangelist to hand out tracts, visit hospitals, and share testimonies in the streets.

The children are very healthy because they receive a balanced diet of rice, wheat, eggs, fish, vegetables, and some fruit. In the area of the home, draughts have caused food prices to double.

- There are 4,635 distinct people groups in India.

- There are 407 languages spoken in India and 53 of the languages have the complete Bible.
- ₱ The population is 80% Hindu, 12.5% Muslim, and only 2.4% Christian.
- ♣ India is the second largest Islamic nation with 140 million Muslims.
- ♣ In India, nearly 400 million people are under the age of 18; more than 70 million are child laborers; 10 million are bonded laborers (a form of slavery to pay off family debts); 13 million are homeless; 2 million are street children without families and over 575,000 are child prostitutes.
- ♣ AIDS has spread rapidly. The major source of infection is drug use.
